Service Highlights

Financial Highlights



- \$48,171 in funds leveraged through administrative claiming during the 2021-22 school year.
- \$362,319 in proportional benefit from regional funds awarded in the 2021-22 school year for competitive grants written by NWRESA.

- 51 babies and young children enrolled in Early Intervention/Early Childhood Special Education (EI/ECSE) (Nov. 2022).
- 81 babies and young children evaluated for eligibility to receive EI/ECSE services (July 2021 to June 2022).
