DN-AR: possible revision to the board policy around donations of ortho equipment. Currently our surplus policy requires us to sell equipment valued at over \$1,000. We are wondering if there is an opportunity to adjust the policy for equipment used by RIS programs? What I'm trying to accomplish here is better stewardship of our statewide orthopedic equipment management. We want to be more efficient about getting equipment to kids all around the state and minimize the amount of useful equipment that we store in warehouses. Large programs like ours and CRIS have a high volume of excess of equipment, while smaller programs like IMESD and SCESD struggle to get what they need.
